The warehouse is an assembly line of work with dozens of stations each with the same purpose of preparing the boxes to be sent to children overseas. Volunteers come to work in the warehouse to prepare these particular O.C.C. shoeboxes that were being sent to South Africa.

My job was to inspect the shoeboxes by looking for any items that go against shoebox guidelines. You see A LOT of shoeboxes while doing this process, each of them containing different items to go to a child.

To go from seeing the kids put all these boxes together at camp then seeing them onto the next step before they get sent was so beautiful.
